

# Peninsula Co-op Educational Scholarship

The Peninsula Co-op Student Awards Program has been developed to recognize the academic efforts, athletic achievements, community service and spirit of cooperation demonstrated by students graduating from high school in the community. The awards are intended to assist financially with the pursuit of a post-secondary education. The Peninsula Co-op Student Awards Program is exclusively for active member-owners in good standing with Peninsula Co-op and their immediate family\*. Memberships must be active as of or prior to September 1 of the current year qualify for consideration.

## Peninsula Co-op Educational Scholarship Two Awards - \$1,500 and \$1,000 This is the only award administered directly by Peninsula Co-op

This award recognizes outstanding academic achievement, balanced with support for the community, your school and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Applicants will be pursuing post-secondary education in any field at an educational institution <u>outside</u> of the Vancouver Island area.

- 1. You must be completing grade 12 this year and, in a position to graduate at the end of the school year.
- 2. You must have achieved at least 85% average in grade 11 and 12 and met the BC provincial graduation requirements.
- 3. You must be accepted at a post-secondary institution <u>outside</u> of the Vancouver Island area for the same year that you graduate.
- 4. You must have contributed to your community and/or school through volunteer or extracurricular activities.

#### **Deadline and Notification:**

Deadline for submission of all documents for the Peninsula Co-op Educational Award is August 31<sup>st</sup>. Successful applicants will be notified in October and will receive their award in November.

- 2. A maximum two-page resume, in point form, detailing your community, school and extracurricular activities including how many hours you devoted in each area during Grades 11 and 12. Your resume should also include a list of your scholastic achievements.
- 3. A transcript of your Grade 11 and 12 <u>final marks</u>. If final Grade 12 marks are not provided with the application the application will not be considered.
- 4. A copy of your post-secondary institution acceptance confirmation. Please note that the post-secondary institution must be located <u>outside</u> of Vancouver Island.
